## Ship Watch

We've had a few visitors of note since our last newsletter. Less than a week after the *Saginaw* arrived to deliver to the grain elevator, the *Algoma Intrepid* arrived with a load of salt from Cleveland. We had gotten accustomed to seeing one salt shipment for the year arriving in October. This made it extra surprising to have a shipment of salt in June, especially when a week later the *Intrepid* was back with a second one! Maybe they wanted to be extra sure that we were well supplied after our last winter.

On July 20, the tug *Jarret M* arrived in Owen Sound. Originally known as the *Atomic*, it was built right here in Owen Sound by Russel Brothers back in 1945. It arrived in preparations for towing a barge to do work near Meaford.

On July 26, the *Playfair* returned to Owen Sound. This brigantine-rigged sailing vessel travels the Great Lakes with teenage crews, teaching them not just how to sail, but how to work in unique environments.


## Curator's Corner: A Lasting Legacy

On July 20, the McKeil tug *Jarret M* arrived in Owen Sound. This was of note to us here at the museum because the *Jarret M* was previously known as the *Atomic*, and its hull was built right here in Owen Sound back in 1945.

Along with over 1000 other hulls, the *Atomic* was built by Russel Brothers in Owen Sound. Our Russel Brothers spotlight often falls on the most well known constructions, like the Ancaster or Maid of the Mist, but they have another legacy in how many of their builds are still alive and well 80 years after construction.

From WWII era tugs under civilian ownership after over 80 years to the *Wm. Lyon Mackenzie* which has been working Toronto's harbour since the 60s, there are plenty of examples of Russel Bros. longevity.

The *Jarret M* is an excellent example of this longevity since even 80 years after construction, she's still working as a project tug. The tug's work assembling and transporting a barge to Meaford shows that a Russel tug, properly maintained, will last a lifetime.
